Action and proven success speaks louder than rhetoric and empty promises. Our next school board member should be a citizen of this county who has shown commitment to our community, our businesses, and our education system. Being a well-rounded passionate individual with a proven track record of success in all these areas is whom I feel the Business Voice should support for school board. My record of proven business board level leadership experience, being an accomplished educator who has received many national, state, and local

awards, and having a history of civic project successes that have inspired our community make up the foundation planks of my campaign.

Being a chairman for organizations such as the Space Coast Economic Development Council, the Melbourne Regional Chamber's Space Coast Tech Council, and my local Suntree Rotary, not only speaks to my involvement in our community but also the level of leadership I have strived to accomplish. As an educator winning awards which include Veterans of Foreign Wars National Teacher of the Year, Wal-Mart Teacher of the Year, Warren Tracy Beginning Teacher of the Year for Florida, Brevard County Social Studies Teacher of the Year, and Brevard County Coach of the Year to name a few shows my commitment to the education system. Flying water filtration systems into Haiti, removing derelict boats from our waterways, and fighting to pass the All American Flag Act shows my proven collaborative community project based successes.

My actions have shown my commitment to our community, our businesses, and our youth. This makes for a well-rounded passionate candidate with a proven track record of success that will help keep Brevard Schools attracting new businesses and individuals to the Space Coast. I feel these traits exemplify what the Business Voice is looking for in a candidate, and why I am the best choice for your nomination.

3. Describe your experience that qualifies you for the position you seek.

Elected school board members are decision makers for the largest budget, group of buildings, and staff in the county. Board members also have to understand curriculum policy that effects the classroom and the students within the walls of our school system. Having the most experience and understanding of each of these areas is crucial to having a strong school system that draws companies and talented employees to our county. The following are the most important issues and areas that a current candidate needs to have experience in to help our school system.

Expansion of Vocational Programs – We are the largest manufacturing county in the state and the eighth largest in the country. As manufacturing jobs are now coming back onshore companies are scrambling to fill the workforce needs to fill the contract orders. Over 50% of our workforce will retire in the next twelve years. We need to create programs that will train our students, and returning veterans to fill these positions. As Chairman of the Space Coast Economic Development Council's Certified Production Technician Committee we have successfully filled over forty-five jobs and am currently expanding the program to train more than one hundred in the coming year. As Chairman of the Space Coast Tech Council's Manufacturing Committee I have begun to put together the first Career and Technical Fair in sixteen years in Brevard County, and created the first private on the job training position with Structural Composites in Brevard in over fourteen years. This will show our students what types of manufacturing industries are here in Brevard, and give then the on the job training needed for them to gain experience.

Facilities and Construction - The School board has the largest footprint of buildings in the county. Understanding how a facility works and the construction it takes to build it is crucial. I feel that my experience as a board member on the Sales Tax Exemption Committee and growing up on my fathers construction sites have given me the experience needed to understand chiller systems to low voltage IT, and security infrastructure. On the Sales Tax

Committee I have reduced cost through suggesting purchasing bulk items now to avoid future rise in costs, and grouping projects for competitive bidding. I also was able to find out reasons why millions of dollars of chillers are failing across the county and made policy changes to avoid those future pitfalls.

Budget and Cost Reduction – The school Board Budget is the largest in the county. Understanding how it works and focusing on areas that may reduce cost are crucial. Through policies I introduced as a member of the Super Intendants Health Insurance Committee, my colleagues and I collaborated to bring a seventy five million dollar Health Insurance budget that had an eighteen million dollar deficit to a twelve million dollar surplus in one year. We introduced innovative programs to drive healthier habits, drove individuals to basic generic drugs, and forced contracted companies to give prescription rebates and other services to help reduce the cost. I have also presented on privatizing the school lunch counter and using advertising on our maintenance vehicles to increase revenue for school programs.

Collaboration – Collaboration and buy in from all entities is crucial to create the change desired. My roll as an educator and now a businessman in the private sector has given me the opportunity to receive the respect from the entities involved because of my work on many successful projects. The All American Flag Act is an example of how myself along with other teachers and students pulled together veterans, businesses, city governments, and the education community to pass a very honorable piece of legislation.

Education Curriculum / System Experiences – It is crucial to understand the curriculum and systems that are currently in place to try and effect change to them in a positive way. As the end of year tests were being handed down from the state in 2012, our school board was in a panic to develop a system to prepare our teachers to teach the new standards. I met with a handful of teachers over the summer and developed the end of year test plan in the form a publication that the Social Studies teachers used to help become more prepared for the test. This publication is still in use for our teachers today. I also wrote the social studies curriculum for the Space Coast High School STEAM and Teacher Academy in 2008, and am certified to teach Advanced Placement, and Cambridge college curriculums.

It is due to my experiences in these areas that I feel I have the capability to make our Brevard School System a national leader in achievement.
