9. How many volunteers do you have engaged in your campaign and describe how you are engaging them? I have a team of approximately 50 volunteers in the Brevard Dems as well as in Orange County. I am actively welcoming NPAs to join our group as well. Many of our volunteers are working on campaigns for other candidates as well. For example, in North Brevard portion of House District 50 we overlap with Mel Martin, candidate for Florida Senate 14 and Sanjay Patel, candidate for Congressional District 8. In Orange County I am working with Sanjay Patel in the Wedgefield, Bithlo, and Christmas area where we overlap as well with Nicolette Springer, candidate for Orange County Commission District 4 and several candidates for School Board in District 2. We knock on doors and will be phone banking as well as hosting small events in their neighborhoods.
