1. In the next 10 years, what do you believe will be the top three critical needs of Floridians/Brevard Country residents? What role will the office you are seeking play in helping meet these needs, and what plans do you have to help us do so?

Overgrowth, traffic, good jobs. I would like to see the Port have responsible growth, contribute to solving traffic issues, and providing good jobs and opportunities for new business at the Port.

I think far to often this Port is more focused on the benefits to the state and not the local constituency. If they did I'm betting the Port would be doing even better both financially and popularity wise.

I would like to change the course of the Port to make it more business friendly and more community friendly. I would also like to hold these businesses that make promises of thousands of jobs either perform or leave the Port. (GTUSA is one such example.)

Pre-Interview Questions

(For School Board and Port Commission races)

1. Please describe your experience in financial management, budgeting or oversight that would qualify you to oversee the large budget of the school district/port?

I have been running businesses for 40 years with many financial management decisions made by myself or with my input. I have been monitoring the financials of the Port for the last few years and it concerns me how there is no recognition of the problems that this current Commission has created with their financial adventurism.

2. Both the School Board and the Port Commission set the tone for their respective organizations. Please describe the role you hope to play in leading these organizations, from a public perception as well as internally.

I would like to play the role of repairing the community and Port relationship. Over the past few years many times the Port has taken a position that was contradictory to the Community's wishes. The train through Merritt Island is a great example of this issue. I was leading the effort to kill the train through N Merritt Island.
